Love	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: John 13:34-35, 1 Corinthians 13 • Love is foundational to the Christian faith. Jesus taught that love for God and love for others are the greatest commandments. A Bible-believing church values unconditional love, forgiveness, and compassion for all people.
Faithfulness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: Matthew 25:21, Hebrews 11:1 • Faithfulness to God, His Word, and His calling is essential. Church members should be steadfast in their commitment to living out the teachings of Scripture, attending worship, and serving others.
Integrity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: Proverbs 10:9, Colossians 3:23 • Integrity means living with honesty and transparency and doing what is right according to God's Word. A church that values integrity seeks to reflect God's righteousness in all things.
Evangelism and Discipleship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: Matthew 28:18-20, 2 Timothy 2:2 • A Bible-believing church values spreading the gospel and making disciples of all nations. The church should prioritize outreach, both locally and globally, and focus on helping people grow spiritually and mature in their faith.
Holiness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: 1 Peter 1:15-16, Romans 12:1-2 • Christians are called to live lives set apart for God. A Bible-believing church encourages its members to pursue holiness, to live lives that honor God, and to avoid sin.
Prayer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: Philippians 4:6-7, 1 Thessalonians 5:17 • Prayer is a vital part of a Bible-believing church. The church should encourage personal and corporate prayer, relying on God for guidance, strength, and intervention.
Service and Compassion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: Mark 10:45, Matthew 25:40 • Following the example of Christ, a Bible-believing church values serving others with humility. Whether it's caring for the poor, visiting the sick, or providing support to those in need, the church is called to be a light in the community through acts of service.
Unity in Christ	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: Ephesians 4:3, 1 Corinthians 1:10 • The church should strive to maintain unity among believers, despite differences in background, culture, or personal preferences. All members are part of the body of Christ and should work together in love and harmony.
Worship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: John 4:24, Psalm 95:6 • True worship is about more than singing—it is about honoring God with every aspect of life. A Bible-believing church values both corporate worship and personal devotion to God, recognizing that worship is a lifestyle.
Stewardship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: 1 Peter 4:10, Matthew 25:14-30 • Stewardship involves using God's resources wisely—whether time, talents, or finances—to further His kingdom. A Bible-believing church encourages responsible stewardship and teaches members to be generous and faithful in their giving.
Accountability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: Galatians 6:1-2, James 5:16 • A Bible-believing church values the importance of accountability within the body of believers. Members should support one another, encourage growth, and lovingly correct each other when necessary.
Grace and Forgiveness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scripture Reference: Ephesians 4:32, Matthew 18:21-22 • Grace and forgiveness should be central to the culture of the church, as they are core aspects of the gospel message. A Bible-believing church values extending grace and forgiveness to others, just as God has forgiven us.
